Your Board encourages all residents, *new and old* to remain aware of the Towne Lake "Covenants, Guidelines and ARC requirements", which were established when the neighborhood was initially built in 1992, to protect and enhance everyone's property values. Your continued cooperation will be sincerely appreciated, as the Homeowners Association Board is charged to enforce these covenants.

The top four covenant violations are:

1. Vehicles parked on the street overnight
2. Trash on curb before 4pm Tuesday
3. Outside repairs without ARC approval (no more \$50 fee)
4. Mailboxes needing repair or paint

Residents should have noticed the permanent new enhanced lighting of the trees in the median along the Technacenter Dr. entrance, as well as the bright array of Christmas lights that are now in place and lighted up each night during the Holiday Season at the Atlanta Highway entrance, Castle Pines Circle, Towne Lake Dr., Green Chase Dr., Whiltshire Dr. and Daleshire Place.

We also want to thank a couple of Towne Lake residents that generously contribute to the beauty of the neighborhood, one by supplying electrical power for Christmas lights on the West side of the Daleshire Place entrance, and to the resident who always places the beautiful Christmas lights along the #15 Lake Bridge.

Two important dates not to forget are Saturday morning, December 18, when Santa Claus arrives in the neighborhood at 10 AM., and January 13th, when the 2011 General Homeowners Association meeting will be held in Arrowhead Country Club from 7:00 to 8:30 PM.

Finally, please keep your vehicles locked at all times if they are not parked in a closed garage.

Neighborhood News Group and Neighborhood Watch

We have not made any substantive changes to our website – www.townelakemontgomery.com - for several years now, and I am looking for any input on ways it can be improved. This website actually serves as a marketing piece for our neighborhood for people wanting to move here, which is why it has so many links that a current resident may not care about. However, if there are more things like the FAQ's page, or the fishing section, that you think we should add, please let us know at the next general association meeting in January.

Our "closed" neighborhood news site now has 279 people's email addresses, many of which are duplicates for the same household, but we have over half the neighborhood receiving updates from this site. Residents may request to be added by following the "Neighborhood Watch" link on the main Towne Lake site shown above. You must be manually admitted to this site, so that only residents are involved in any discussions.

Finally, in regards to our Neighborhood Watch program, we have had a variety of reports on the website lately regarding suspicious activities and even a burglary. Although we live in one of the nicest neighborhoods in one of the best parts of town, we can't let our guard down. Here are some words of advice posted on our Website:

At our October TLHOA board meeting, we voted to no longer require a \$50 fee even for improvements so the only time a fee is required on an ARC request is if you are building a new home (we have to send the plans to an architect for review).
